# **Medical Updates and Health Considerations**

It is extremely important that the school is aware of any medical conditions or other health considerations that your child/ren may have. If you are new to the school or aware of any new medical conditions or other health considerations that may have developed over the holidays, then please come and collect the appropriate forms from the Office as soon as possible.

For students with existing medical plans, new medical forms will be sent home in the coming weeks for your child's medical plans to be updated. These forms need to be completed on a yearly basis and, where necessary, signed by your doctor. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

# **Allergy Aware School**

St John's School is an allergy aware school. The foods that are particularly life-threatening for some of our students are **nuts** (**peanuts and tree nuts**) **and eggs**. We ask that students do not bring these foods to school in their lunch boxes.

Students are learning about ways they can help their classmates who have allergies stay safe. There are several posters around the school reminding the school community of the steps they can take to do this. Most of the steps are common practise in our school but it is useful for everyone to be reminded of these important steps.

# The steps include:

- 1. Don't share your food, especially with friends who have allergies.
- 2. Wash your hands before and after eating.
- 3. Know what your friends are allergic to.
- 4. If a schoolmate who has allergies becomes sick, get help straight away.

Your assistance to help keep everyone safe at our school is much appreciated.

# WHY VOLUNTEER FOR THE P&F

# FUNCTIONS OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

The functions of the Advisory Council include working with the Principal on:

- a) support planning for the present and future operation of the Catholic school;
- b) provide membership, at the principal's request, on selection panels for the employment of staff to the Catholic school in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policies and Executive Directives;
- c) provide membership on the panel that recommends the appointment of a Principal in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policy and Executive Directives;
- d) in consultation with the Principal, communicate about the Catholic school and about Catholic education to persons and organisations in the School Community;
- e) endorse the Catholic school's annual budget before submission to CECWA for approval; and
- f) advise the Principal on school financial matters such as performance against budget, sustainability, and capital and recurrent planning.

# MEMBERSHIP OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

Membership of the School Advisory Council is based on:

- a) a commitment and desire to promote Catholic education and give service to the Catholic School Community;
- b) a commitment to the safety, wellbeing and pastoral care of all students and staff;
- c) an ability to work cooperatively and constructively with the Principal, school leadership team and all other members of the Advisory Council;
- d) the possession of skills, competencies and experience that are reflective of, relevant and beneficial to the Catholic School Community; and
- e) a sufficiency of time to devote to Advisory Council duties.

# **COVID-19 School Operating Guidelines**

# **COVID-19 Student Positive Result**

- Students remain at home until symptoms resolve.
- Register RAT results via WA Health and the CEWA COVID-19 Self-Reporting Portal on the St John's School Website.
- Wear a mask if required to leave the home and when accessing public transport (including school transport).
- Avoid large gatherings and crowded, indoor locations. COVID-19 positive persons cannot visit public hospitals and other high risk settings for 7 days.

# **Close Contacts**

A close contact is defined as a person from within the same household or a person who has had household-like contact with a COVID-19 positive person, during that person's infectious period.

- Isolation of close contacts is no longer mandated but close contacts are encouraged to test daily for 5 days and only attend school following a negative RAT result.
- Close contacts may choose to wear a mask.
- Close contacts should register their status as a close contact via the CEWA COVID-19 Self Reporting Portal on the St John's School Website.
- Close contact persons should not attend public hospitals and other high risk settings for 7 days.

### Masks

Staff, students and visitors to a school may choose to wear a mask.

Staff, students and visitors are expected to adhere to any mask wearing requirements of third-party organisations/workplaces.

# **Attendance**

Consistent with the direction from the Minister of Education, schools are open for learning and students must attend in accordance with the Education Act.

# Ventilation

Schools are required to maintain strong ventilation practices, meaning the use of natural and mechanical modes of air flow through classrooms and indoor spaces.

# Cleaning

Schools should ensure that cleaning providers utilise detergent and disinfectant agents for high contact surfaces. Consistent and thorough schedules should be maintained throughout the school.
