All Saints' Day - Friday 1 November

On Friday 1 November, the Catholic Church will celebrate the Feast of All Saints.

Did you know that there is a link between the Pagan celebration of Halloween and the Catholic celebration of All Saints' Day?

'Hallow' is a word that means 'Holy'. We even say it in the Our Father, 'hallowed be thy name'. We celebrate All Saints' Day on 1 November. This day can also be called 'All Hallows Day' because it's the day about all the Holy people, the Saints. The day before All Saints' Day is called 'All Hallows Eve', just like the day before Christmas is called 'Christmas Eve'. Over time, people just started saying 'Halloween' instead of 'All Hallows Eve'. Unfortunately, people started dressing as ghosts and scary things on All Hallows Eve when they should have really been dressing as saints. I encourage all families to remind the children of the importance of All Saints' Day should you be celebrating Halloween this year.

The Year Two Class will be leading an 8.45am morning Prayer Assembly on Friday 1 November, in the School Hall, in celebration of All Saint's Day. Everyone is welcome to attend.

ST JOHN'S SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL NOMINATION

There will be an opportunity for a member of the school community to serve on the School Advisory Council this year. Interested persons are requested to nominate themselves, seek nomination or nominate others to this important position in our school community.

FUNCTIONS OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

The functions of the Advisory Council include working with the Principal on:

- a) support planning for the present and future operation of the Catholic school;
- provide membership, at the principal's request, on selection panels for the employment of staff to the Catholic school in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policies and Executive Directives;
- provide membership on the panel that recommends the appointment of a Principal in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policy and Executive Directives;
- d) in consultation with the Principal, communicate about the Catholic school and about Catholic education to persons and organisations in the School Community;
- e) endorse the Catholic school's annual budget before submission to CECWA for approval; and
- advise the Principal on school financial matters such as performance against budget, sustainability, and capital and recurrent planning.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

Membership of the School Advisory Council is based on:

- a commitment and desire to promote Catholic education and give service to the Catholic School Community;
- b) a commitment to the safety, wellbeing and pastoral care of all students and staff;
- an ability to work cooperatively and constructively with the Principal, school leadership team and all other members of the Advisory Council;
- the possession of skills, competencies and experience that are reflective of, relevant and beneficial to the Catholic School Community; and
- e) a sufficiency of time to devote to Advisory Council duties.


