This was a difficult decision to make as we are conscious of the cost of living for all members of the school community and as a school, we have also had to navigate price rises across all areas of our budget.

I would like to remind all parents/carers that should the cost of the school fees ever become problematic, please make an appointment to come and see me so we can discuss a mutually suitable solution. School fees should never be a reason for any family to think that their child cannot receive a Catholic education.

St John's School Feast Day

On **Thursday 21 November at 9.00am**, the school community will gather to celebrate St John's School Feast Day. The 21 November has been chosen to celebrate our Feast Day as this date coincides with the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on this day, whom the Presentation Sisters' Order is based upon. The Presentation Sisters were the founding sisters of St John's School.

Annual General Meeting of the Catholic Parishes of Geraldton is on Sunday, 17th November at 10.30am in the Catholic Centre. Parishioners from all parishes are invited and encouraged to attend.

Grand Nativity Display in Our Parish for a Week

Marking the conclusion of 800th anniversary of the First Nativity Scene created by St Francis of Assisi in Italy in 1223, Father Savio is setting up a grand nativity display with more than 150 nativity sets of various sizes, nature and culture. The display will be in the Catholic Centre for a week commencing from **Sunday, 24th November to Sunday 1st December.**

Please do not mis out this unique and once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see this grand display in our Parish. The initial concept of this exhibition is from the Administrator Father Gerard Totanes, who himself is a member of the Secular Franciscan Order. Saint Francis of Assisi had a special devotion to the Child Jesus. It is believed that Saint Francis was first inspired by this idea after visiting the historical place of Christ's birth on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, the humble stable in a Bethlehem cave.

It is likely that this event deepened his devotion to the Child Jesus, who was born into the world in such poverty, humility, and simplicity. In fact, St Francis founded his new religious Order to imitate these very virtues which are very hard to find in the modern world even among the Catholics. Saint Francis recreated the scene of Christ's birth in a special ritual and Mass he held inside of a cave in Greccio, Italy, inviting both his fellow friars and the townspeople to join in the celebration. Saint Francis' recreation of that first Christmas night was so popular that the devotion spread to private homes, and in modern times even to secular institutions, so much so that it's now impossible to imagine Christmas without a nativity

scene to behold. It is a historic Catholic tradition and a tool for meditation on the humility, simplicity, and poverty of Christ that he took on, from the moment of his Incarnation, out of his boundless love for his lost sheep.

FUNCTIONS OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

The functions of the Advisory Council include working with the Principal on:

- a) support planning for the present and future operation of the Catholic school;
- provide membership, at the principal's request, on selection panels for the employment of staff to the Catholic school in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policies and Executive Directives;
- provide membership on the panel that recommends the appointment of a Principal in accordance with the relevant CECWA Policy and Executive Directives;
- d) in consultation with the Principal, communicate about the Catholic school and about Catholic education to persons and organisations in the School Community;
- e) endorse the Catholic school's annual budget before submission to CECWA for approval; and
- advise the Principal on school financial matters such as performance against budget, sustainability, and capital and recurrent planning.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

Membership of the School Advisory Council is based on:

- a) a commitment and desire to promote Catholic education and give service to the Catholic School Community;
- b) a commitment to the safety, wellbeing and pastoral care of all students and staff;
- an ability to work cooperatively and constructively with the Principal, school leadership team and all other members of the Advisory Council;
- the possession of skills, competencies and experience that are reflective of, relevant and beneficial to the Catholic School Community; and
- e) a sufficiency of time to devote to Advisory Council duties.

WHY VOLUNTEER FOR THE P&F

- It is for the children. Once we have children our lives (and time) are never the same again. We are changed
 for the better and they are a driving force behind a lot of things we do. We might only get paid in hugs,
 kisses, and fridge artwork (less if you have a teen) but it is worth it in the end.
- Fosters a sense of community. It takes a village to raise a child and, in a world where we don't always live
 with our family close by, our village becomes more diverse and often school centred.
- It is a great way to learn skills. Getting involved with the P&F is a great way to start building skills if you have been out of the workforce for a while.

Useful items for a Christmas hamper.


- 1. Canned Goods (e.g., soup, beans, vegetables, fruits, tuna)


